Artist Self-Publishers' Fair - The Sixth

The Artist Self Publishers' Fair (ASP Fair) will return for its 6th edition on **Saturday 26** and **Sunday 27 September 2020** with over 100 international and UK artist self-publishers.

Due to restrictions around Covid 19 ASP The Sixth will be presented online at www.aspfair.uk.

We are reimagining the fair within the current situation to present ASP 6 as a streaming bizarre - a 2-way cable TV experience with 100 channels of live artists.

ASP Fair seeks to highlight the practice of self-publishing and provides a platform for artists wishing to present work that circumvents the market mechanisms and constraints of the contemporary art world.

Visitors are free to meet the artists on their digital stalls and browse their publications, with prices starting as low as £2.

Over the weekend visitors will also have access to live streams of interviews, guest slots, music, readings, book launches, films, plays and performances with artists from their own front rooms and studios. A selection of the self-publishers includes: **Pound Shop**; **Racheal Crowther**; **Fuck Zines**; **Emily Pope**; **Black Lodge Press**; **Hate Zine**; **Behind the X** and **Nervemeter**.

Special guests performances will be presented on Saturday 26 September, from 2:00 – 7:00pm, featuring trans-chancers **The Right Lube**; interdisciplinary artist **R.I.P. Germain**; and musicians **Lolina** and **Scratcha DVA**.

In addition to the 85 self-publishers already selected by ASP, 15 places will be allocated via open submission. The closing date for submissions is **16 August 2020**.

The ASP Fair has been made possible with the generous help of Arts Council England and the Institute of Contemporary Arts, London.

ASP Fair is co-founded by Dan Mitchell and Sara MacKillop.
